frankenstein or the modern prometheus generally known as frankenstein is a novel written by the british author mary shelley the title of the novel refers to a scientist victor frankenstein who learns how to create life and creates a being in the likeness of man but larger than average and more powerful in popular culture people have tended to refer to the creature as frankenstein despite this being the name of the scientist frankenstein is a novel infused with some elements of the gothic novel and the romantic movement it was also a warning against the over reaching of modern man and the industrial revolution alluded to in the novel s subtitle the modern prometheus the story has had an influence across literature and popular culture and spawned a complete genre of horror stories and films it is arguably considered the first fully realized science fiction novel

mary shelley began writing frankenstein when she was only eighteen at once a gothic thriller a passionate romance and a cautionary tale about the dangers of science frankenstein tells the story of committed science student victor frankenstein obsessed with discovering the cause of generation and life and bestowing animation upon lifeless matter frankenstein assembles a human being from stolen body parts but upon bringing it to life he recoils in horror at the creature s hideousness tormented by isolation and loneliness the once innocent creature turns to evil and unleashes a campaign of murderous revenge against his creator frankenstein frankenstein an instant bestseller and an important ancestor of both the horror and science fiction genres not only tells a terrifying story but also raises profound disturbing questions about the very nature of life and the place of humankind within the cosmos what does it mean to be human what responsibilities do we have to each other how far can we go in tampering with nature in our age filled with news of organ donation genetic engineering and bio terrorism these questions are more relevant than ever

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annotations this book is unique because it contains a literary criticism that was made by jannette torresthe novel tells the story of victor frankenstein a young swiss medical student in ingolstadt obsessed with knowing the secrets of heaven and earth in his eagerness to unravel the mysterious soul of man victor creates a body from the union of different parts of dissected corpses the experiment concludes with success when frankenstein surrounded by his instruments infuses a spark of life into the monstrous body it should be noted that the monster of frankenstein is known in popular culture as frankenstein but in reality in the whole work said being does not have a real name only appeals such as demonic being engendro the creature horrendous guest victor frankenstein now understands the horror he has created rejects with horror the result of his experiment and flees his laboratory upon returning to him the monster has disappeared and he believes that everything is over but the shadow of his sin pursues him the monster after fleeing the laboratory feels the rejection of humanity and awoken in him the hatred and thirst for revenge after a period of convalescence due to overwork and after learning of the murder of his little brother william victor returns to his native geneva with his family and his fiancée only to discover that behind the crime is the furor of the creature that he has brought to life victor's guilt becomes greater when he allows a friend of the family to be condemned and executed accused of the crime he decides to go to the mountain to recover his depressed mood near the montblanc he meets the monster again this tells him how he learned to talk secretly spying on a family to which he offered small gifts anonymously and how the family rejected him when he discovered his physical and mental appearance a rejection that was repeated before each encounter with human beings now the creature promises not to return to victor's life but asks him as he asks his creator to complete his work and create a companion for him his speech and his motives are so eloquent that v

frankenstein or the modern prometheus is an 1818 novel written by english author mary shelley 1797 1851 that tells the story of victor frankenstein a young scientist who creates a sapient creature in an unorthodox scientific experiment shelley started writing the story when she was 18 and the first edition was published anonymously in london on 1 january 1818 when she was 20 her name first appeared in the second edition published in paris in 1821 shelley travelled through europe in 1815 along the river rhine in germany stopping in gernsheim 17 kilometres 11 mi away from frankenstein castle where two centuries before an alchemist engaged in experiments she then journeyed to the region of geneva switzerland where much of the story takes place the topics of galvanism and occult ideas were themes of conversation among her companions particularly her lover and future husband percy b shelley in 1816 mary percy and lord byron had a competition to see who could write the best horror story after thinking for days shelley dreamt about a scientist who created life and was horrified by what he had made inspiring the novel though frankenstein is infused with elements of the gothic novel and the romantic movement brian aldiss has argued that it should be considered the first true science fiction story in contrast to previous stories with fantastical elements resembling those of later science fiction aldiss states the central character makes a deliberate decision and turns to modern experiments in the laboratory to achieve fantastic results it has had a considerable influence in literature and popular culture and spawned a complete genre of horror stories films and plays since the publication of the novel the name frankenstein has often been used to refer to the monster itself
